Step 1 One-to-One Counseling

Private Educational Sessions

Meet with one of our Diabetes Educators for a general diabetes information and education session to begin to gain the necessary skills needed to manage your diabetes.

Ongoing support is only a phone call away and you can call us anytime with questions. We will follow up with you at three and six month intervals to check on your status and answer your questions.

Free Glucometers

Free glucometers can be obtained from the Diabetes Educator along with training on how to use them.

Starting on Insulin

If your physician has determined that it is time to start insulin, you can meet individually with a Diabetes Educator to learn about storage and administration of insulin, site selection, and more.

Insulin Pump

Our educators are certified pump trainers and are available to assist you with insulin pump starts and ongoing pump support.

What Do I Eat If I have Diabetes?

Current recommendations for protein, fat, and carbohydrates in your diet. Information on the food pyramid, sugar substitutes, meal planning, label reading, stocking your cupboard, restaurant eating, weight management, special occasion meals and more.

Complications, Exercise, & Stress Management

Physical activity, exercise and your blood sugar; establishing a safe exercise program; stress and diabetes; suggestions for managing stress; sick day guidelines; and avoiding diabetes complications that affect your kidneys, eyes, nerves, heart and foot care.

Monitoring Diabetes & Managing Blood Glucose

Enhance your understanding of diabetes, glucometer testing, handling high and low blood sugars, oral medications, insulin, and the latest in diabetes pattern management.

Carbohydrate Counting Basics for Diabetes

In-depth look at carbohydrates, the glycemic index, and how to apply information to meal plans. Learn terms, including net carbs and net impact carbs. Advanced carbohydrate counting available.

Step 3 Ongoing Education

Continued Counseling

Additional follow-up education sessions are available with a Diabetes Educator.

Continuous Glucose Monitoring

- A screening test for patients to help evaluate current medications, identify low blood sugars and more.
- Real time glucose monitoring for those on insulin pumps.
